Sanok from a bird's eye view

- **Sanok** – the city with a population of 40000 inhabitants stretches over an area of 38 km² and is situated in the south-eastern part of the Podkarpackie Province

Open-air museum

- **The Museum of Folk Architecture in Sanok** – the first and the largest ethnographic museum in Poland in terms of the number of collected objects, established after World War II.



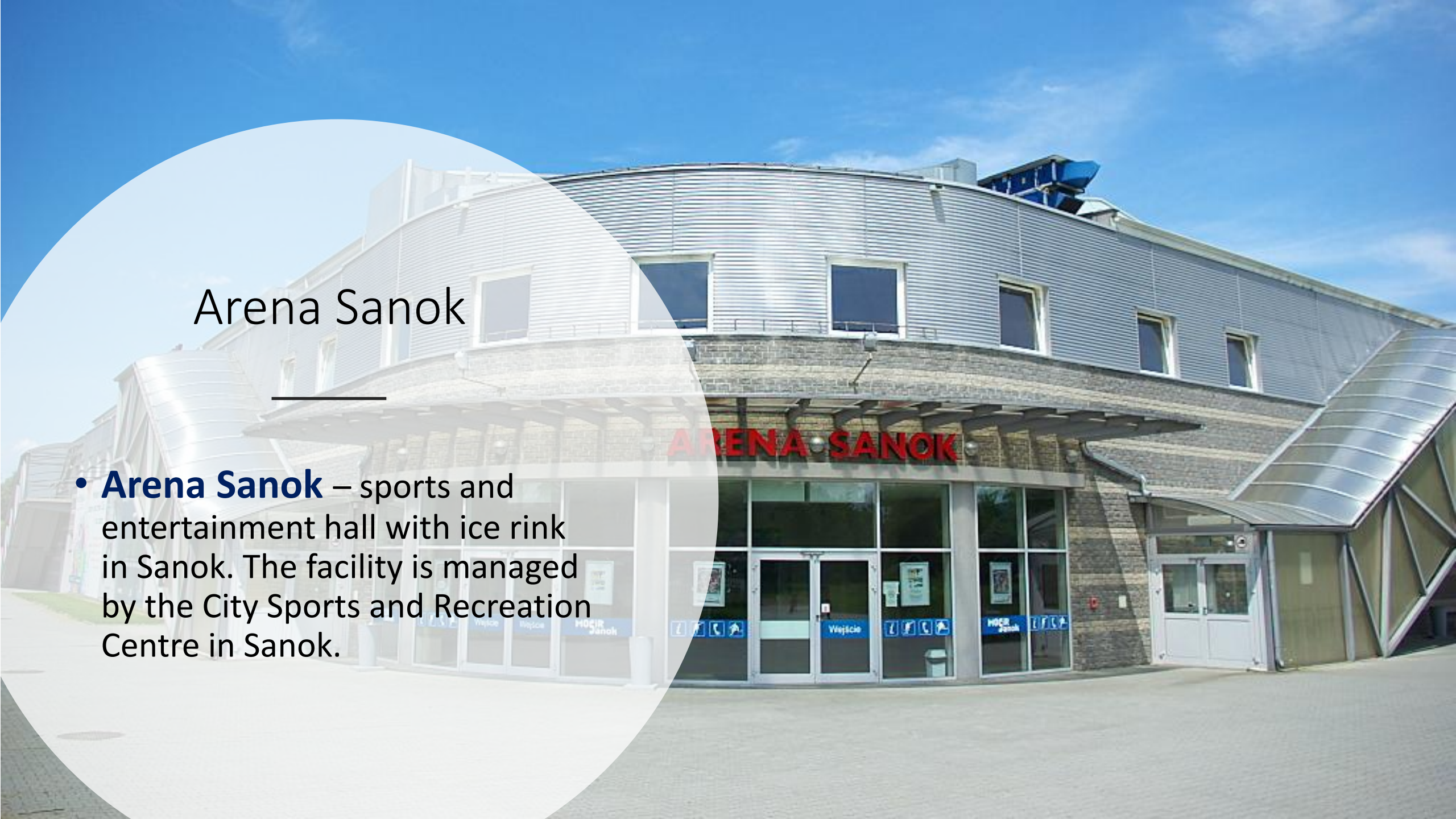
Castle in Sanok

- **The Royal Castle in Sanok** – a castle dating back to the Middle Ages, currently the seat of the Historical Museum, located on Zamkowa Street in Sanok



Arena Sanok


- **Arena Sanok** – sports and entertainment hall with ice rink in Sanok. The facility is managed by the City Sports and Recreation Centre in Sanok.



Autosan

- **Autosan** – a brand of Polish buses, once produced in the Sanok Bus Factory "Autosan", and now by Autosan Sp. z o.o. in Sanok.





The Historical Museum

- **The Historical Museum in Sanok** – regional museum with its seat in Sanok. The museum has collections of old and contemporary art. It conducts cultural activities for the benefit of the inhabitants and the region.

Grzegorz from Sanok

- **Grzegorz from Sanok** – Polish Roman Catholic spiritualist, professor of the Cracow Academy, archbishop and metropolitan of Lviv in the years 1451-1477, the first representative of Renaissance humanism in Poland, scholastic critic and poet.
